

Study Guide Jonah 1- Adrift

1. Read Jonah 1:1-3. Even though God's word is authoritative, why do you think Jonah ran the other way? Read 2 Peter 3:9. What is God's desire?

2. Read Jonah 1:4-8. Can you describe a time when God sent a 'storm' into someone's life to wake him or her out of complacency? What did you observe? What hidden attitudes came to the surface?

3. Read Jonah 1:9-17. Discuss how Jonah started to be honest in the storm. How can it be helpful to be honest with God and ourselves when it comes to what is really happening in our lives?

4. Notice the pivotal point in the story when Jonah is willing to offer up his life to save the crew (type of Christ). What good things start to happen after this?

5. Discuss the concept that God is able to use our failures for His purposes. What might God be doing through our failures, provided we are honest through the process?

6. What does the provision of the whale represent (v.17)? How has God already provided for our rescue?

Application

Pray for God to rescue us from our tendency towards complacency and give us a vision for what His desire is for us as witnesses. Are there any next steps God is revealing to you?

A. When God Speaks (1)

"Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, ..." >on mouse click<

"'Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evilhas come up before me.' But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the Lord."

"So the captain came and said to him, 'What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish.' And they said to one another, 'Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us.' So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. Then they said to him, 'Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?'"

"Instead, the men did their best to row back to land. But they could not, for the sea grew even wilder than before. Then they cried to the LORD, "O LORD, please do not let us die for taking this man's life. Do not hold us accountable for killing an innocent man, for you, O LORD, have done as you pleased." Then they took Jonah and threw him overboard, and the raging sea grew calm. At this <u>the men greatly feared the</u> <u>LORD</u>, and they <u>offered a sacrifice</u> to the LORD and <u>made vows to him</u>.

But <u>the LORD provided</u> a great fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was inside the fish three days and three nights."
